

- Specific job advertised
- Usually one position (unless otherwise stated)
- Application process may not be as intensive as Graduate Program

Networking and Job Seeking

Networking with professionals is an ideal opportunity to learn about opportunities.

- Join professional associations in your respective field
- Attend relevant events and gatherings
- Be prepared to interact and socialise
- Make the first move (introduce yourself)
- Follow up on positive interactions with action (invitation to connect on LinkedIn.

Hot tip: Networking doesn't mean asking people for jobs. It means forging long term relationships and is an opportunity for information gathering.

Networking and Job Seeking

Scenario: You meet an interesting professional working in a firm you would love to work for at a networking event. You ask for their business card and they oblige. Follow-up with an email. In a few months, touch base again via email. In a few months, ask them for a coffee chat. It's not about asking for a job, it's about nurturing long term relationships. The benefit you get out of this relationship is advice and insight.

This puts you front of mind in your network if opportunities arise.
